College Transition Grant

For the past 13 years we have been awarded a state issued College Transitions grant. This program helps adults build (or re-new) skills for enrollment in college level and/or job training courses. We generally offer three semesters a year - two 14-week school years semesters and a nine-week summer session. We run a cohort model, which statistically has resulted in higher persistence in college enrollment, than an a la carte model. Each participant takes four courses: College Readiness, Reading and Writing, Math and Technology.

Presently we are the fiscal agent for Hancock County College Transitions, which includes all of the Adult Education programs in the county. This summer there will be an RFP to continue funding. We are asking permission to submit a proposal for the grant, as well as being the fiscal agent.
